



Figure A1. Protestant Missions across European Empires (1800-1924).















Figure A9. Colonization Effects on Mission Entries across Empires (Robustness, Earliest Source Dates).




Figure A10. Colonization Effects on Mission Entries with Anticipation.




Figure A11. Colonization Effects on Mission Entries using Placebo Treatments.

#### Description of geographic variables

All geographic variables are computed based on the exact geographic location of each mission and secondary geocoded data sources. Annual average values are computed for each year and colonization for all missions present in a given year.

Distance Colonial Capital. Log Distance from each colony's capital. Based on Schvitz et al. (2022).

Distance City (1900). Log Distance to city with more than 10,000 inhabitants in 1900. Based on Becker (2021) and Jedwab and Moradi (2016).

**Population Density** (1800). Pre-colonial population density (Scale converted to hundreds). Based on Klein Goldewijk, Beusen, and Janssen (2010).

Distance Muslim. Log Distance from nearest Muslim center. Based on data from Jedwab, Meier zu Selhausen, and Moradi (2022).

Agricultural Suitability. Crop suitability index for intermediate input level rainfed maize (Scale converted to thousands). Based on raster data from "Global Agroecological Zones (GAEZ v3.0)" (2011) with a 5 arc-minute resolution.

**Distance Water.** Log Distance to nearest body of water. Based on information about rivers and lakes in Africa from www.naturalearth.com; data retrieved through the R package rnaturalearth.

**Distance Coast.** Log Distance to nearest coastline. Based on data from www.nat-uralearth.com; retrieved through the R package rnaturalearth.

**Ruggedness.** Ruggedness of terrain (Scale converted to hundreds). Based on coarsened raster data provided by Shaver, Carter, and Shawa (2016).
